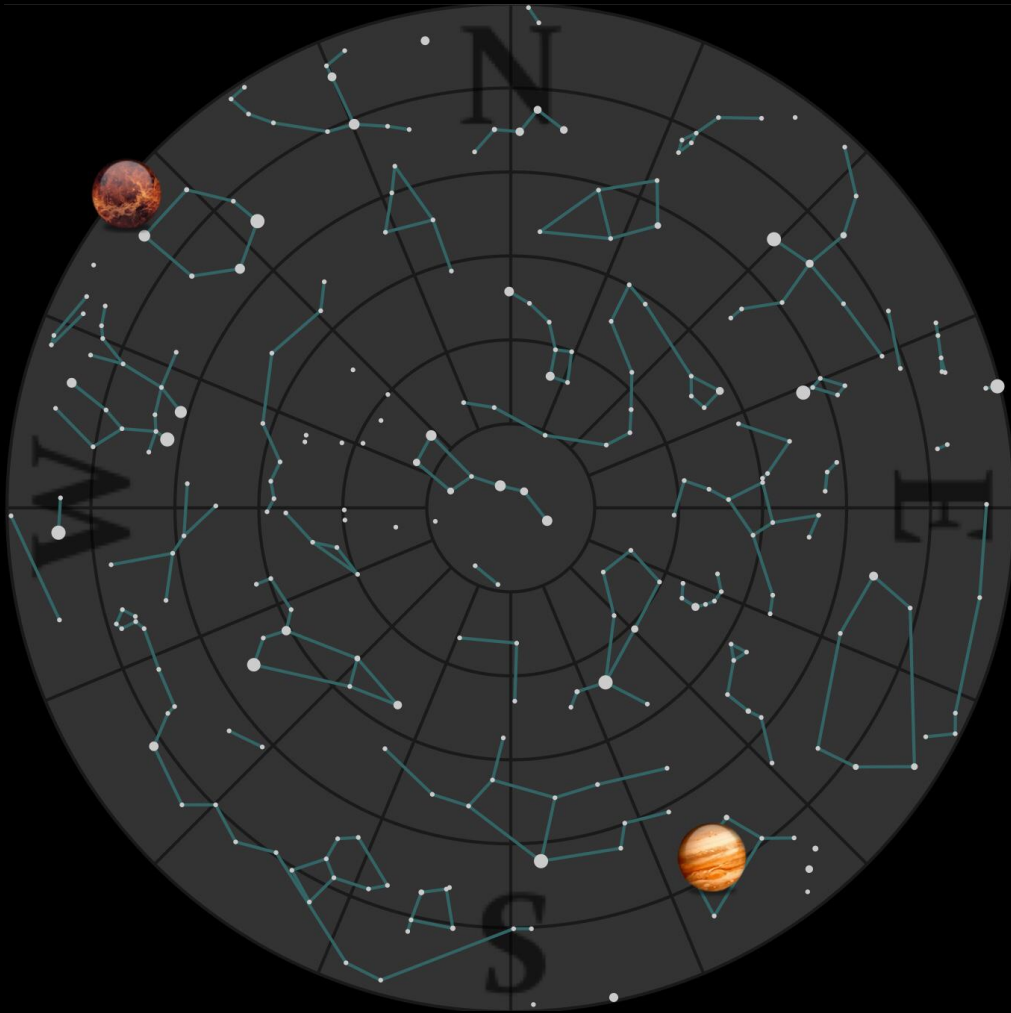

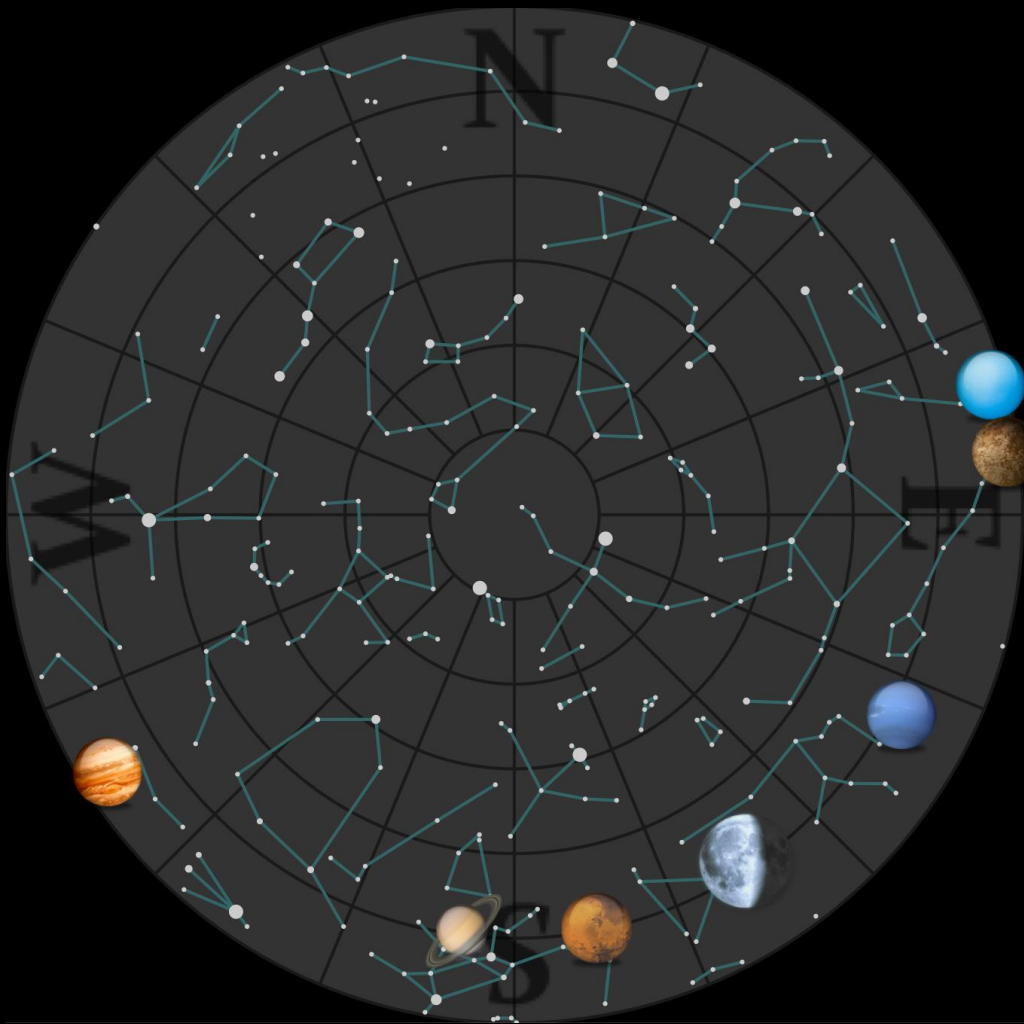

Inner Solar System

- Sun
 - Declination increasing
 - Solstice June 21, Aphelion July 6
- Mercury
 - In morning sky until early June, but not favourable for observation
 - Maximum elongation from Sun was on April 29 (29°)
- Venus
 - In the evening sky until October 2018
 - Maximum elongation and half phase on August 17 (46°)

Earth

- Time
 - 00:00UT \approx 14:59ST today
- Moon
 -  Last Quarter, 8, June 6
 -  New, 15
 -  First Quarter, 22
 -  Full, 29 (Milk or Planting Corn)
- Eclipses
 - None this period
- Meteors
 - η Aquarids, April 24-May 20, ZHR 40

Lunar Occultations

- None of note this period

Outer Solar System

- Mars
 - In morning sky moving away from the Sun, rising around 02:00
 - Perihelic Opposition July 27, but very low altitude
- Jupiter
 - In evening sky and rising at sunset
 - Opposition in two days time on May 9
- Saturn
 - In morning sky, moving away from the Sun, rising around 01:00
 - Opposition June 27, 2018
- Uranus
 - Opposition on October 24, 2018
- Neptune
 - Opposition on September 7, 2018

Historical Anniversary

- June 8 1918
 - Nova Aquilæ independently discovered in Stowmarket by Alice Grace Cook (1877-1952) at 9:30pm
 - She noted in her Klein's Star Atlas “On June 8th 1918 first magnitude = Altair, 18h 45m [RA] +1⁰ [declination]”
 - Discovered by George Noel Bower (1885-1951) observing from Nungambankan, Madras, India, some five hours earlier at 10:00pm IST (4:30pm UT), a customs officer in the Indian Civil Service
 - Other UK observers included
 - W. F. Denning, Bristol
 - W. H. Steavenson, West Norwood
 - Felix de Roy, Thornton Heath
