


 - Declination increasing. Solstice June 21
 - Last sunspot min., Apr. 2020, max., just passed?
- Mercury
 - In the morning sky with greatest elongation on April 21 (27 $^{\circ}$), currently 26 $^{\circ}$, 0 mag
 - Superior conjunction May 30
 - Today, rise 05:00, transit 11:15, set 17:35
- Venus
 - In the morning sky, greatest elongation May 31, (46°) currently 40°
 - Superior conjunction May 06, 2026
 - today, rise 04:10, transit 10:20, set 16:25

Earth

- Time
 - 00:00UT ≈ 14:25ST today
 - Today, sunrise 05:30, transit 12:50, sunset 20:15
 - End of period, sunrise 04:45, transit 12:50, sunset 21:00
- Moon
 - First Quarter, May 04
 - Full, May 12 ('Milk or Flower' Moon)
 - Last Quarter, May 20
 - New, May 27
- Meteors
 - none of note this period

 Conjunction March 19. Opposition September 23. Today, rise 04:30, transit 10:30, set 16:30
